Christians and Memorial Day

Memorial Day, which is always observed on the last Monday in May, is for the purpose of honoring all men and women who died in U.S. military service. Though there is always the danger that we as Christians can blend church and state in such a way that the kingdom of God morphs into a doctrinally thin, spiritually nebulous civil religion, there is still reason for Christians to give thanks for Memorial Day. In Luke 7:9, we see the centurion soldier being held up by Jesus as the best example of faith He's seen in Israel. Make no mistake: military service, when executed with integrity and in the Spirit of God, is a suitable vocation for the people of God. Recall also that there have been many heroic acts and virtues demonstrated by soldiers in the history of war suitable for our admiration. Military service is a common metaphor used in the New Testament to describe the Christian life. When we remember the sacrifice, single-minded dedication, and discipline involved in the life of a soldier, we are calling to mind what we are supposed to be like as Christians in service to Christ. Again, we want to honor all those who have died in service to our country along with their families.
